

Structure and content of the study program

The standard period of study is six semesters on a parttime basis (90 credit points). The consecutive parttime course of study is aimed at students who work practically as consultants in a field of social work. The program is modular and combines theory and practice. The content of the program is based on three pillars:

Theoretical references

- Social challenges and psycho-social counselling needs
- The fundamentals of counselling science
- Application-oriented counselling research

Case work

- Practice-oriented case work and analysis as research-based learning
- Professional relationship building and counselling standards: Understanding and designing counselling processes
- Deepening of elective areas

Professional action

- Normative and ethical frameworks
- Self-experience and self-reflection (biography work, identity as a counselor)
- · Adopting perspectives as an advice seeker

Academic degree

The program concludes with the awarding of the academic degree Master of Arts (M.A.).

Professional fields of activity

Our graduates are able to plan, professionally apply and critically reflect on counselling in all fields of social work. They are able to develop consulting concepts that fit the individual personality and the chosen field of action and to conduct application-related consulting research. They are able to work independently in a consulting, management and research capacity. The completion of this degree program does not lead to state recognition as a social worker.

Why study counselling at EHB?

We are offering the practice-oriented master's degree program "Counselling in Social Work" which started in the winter semester 2018/19. EHB is a proven provider of applied social and health sciences under church sponsorship. We critically engage with professional policy issues and ethical questions. The transdisciplinary Master's program, which includes pedagogical, psychological, sociological, sociopolitical, legal and ethical approaches, qualifies graduates to deal with the diversity and complexity of current challenges in counselling. Important competencies are acquired in the following areas:

- Knowledge of clinical and life-world models of change and interdisciplinary counselling theories.
- Psychosocial, socio-educational diagnostics
- Professional relationship building and conversation skills
- Diversity- and culturally sensitive design of counselling processes
- Normative and social framework conditions of counselling
- Social science research qualifying for a PhD

The program is well networked in the relevant professional fields with authorities, independent institutions and (inter)national colleges and universities. Our graduates have excellent opportunities on the job market. We support them in their career planning.

Admission requirements

The prerequisite for admission to the program is a professionally qualifying university degree in an undergraduate degree program in social work or in another educationally or psychosocially oriented degree program (e.g. childhood pedagogy, community pedagogy, religious pedagogy, educational science, psychology). Applicants must also have worked for at least 12 months in a field of social work in an advisory/social-professional capacity for at least 15 hours per week after graduating from a university or college with a professional qualification and before starting the master's program. The professional activity should be maintained during the study program.
