The aim of the degree program

The aim of the Master's degree program **Management – Education – Diversity** is to enable students to take on management tasks in the areas of municipal, private or church community and educational work as well as in the corresponding professional fields of health and social services. Through the study program, students will be able to apply, expand and deepen their specialised knowledge and methodological skills, also with regard to scientific competencies.

Content focus

The Master's degree program **Management – Education – Diversity** is completed on an obligatory basis in one

of the following majors:

- Health/Social Management,
- Childhood Education and Development,
- Displacement and Migration.

Students are required to study one of the focal areas.

Academic degree

The program concludes with the awarding of the academic degree Master of Arts (M.A.).

Structure of the Master's program

Standard period of study: 3 semesters (90 ECTS credit points) on a full-time basis.

Professional fields of activity

Health/Social Management

Leadership, quality management or development, controlling, e.g. in hospitals; consulting; work in inpatient/outpatient long-term care facilities or in facilities of the child and youth welfare sector, in counselling centres, residential homes/projects or in facilities of the social welfare sector.

Childhood Education and Development

Management and advisory tasks in educational and social institutions such as in child and youth welfare, cooperation in multi-professional teams in extended school management (Berlin School Act); conception and implementation of further education and training measures and political lobbying for children in Germany, Europe and in international organizations. Depending on pre-qualification, work as an ombudsperson and procedural guide in accordance with the German Social Code; basis for further qualification as a "guardian ad litem" (depending on pre-qualification).

Displacement and Migration

Management tasks related to migration and integration in administrative, social, health and educational institutions (middle and higher management; e.g. reception/community institutions, child and youth welfare institutions, social services, offices for integration and migration counselling, church institutions); depending on prior qualifications, employment as a migration social worker, integration officer, integration mediator or specialist consultant in NGOs – all of this is possible.

Prerequisites for studying

- professionally qualifying university degree in an undergraduate degree programme in a social science, humanities, health or humanities discipline (usually 210 ECTS credit points)
- Graduates of a degree programme with 180 ECTS credit points must prove or provide evidence of the missing ECTS credit points through suitable qualifications.

Start of the degree program

The study program begins each **summer semester (April 1)**. The application for admission must be received by EHB by January 15 of the respective year.
