

Information on Health Insurance for Incoming Students

Once Turkish students begin studying, they should submit their A/T11 for the current semester to a statutory health insurance in Germany. The health insurance company will send the electronic insurance certificate to the university after the submission of the documents. An up-to-date A/T11 should be submitted every semester.


When you go to the doctor, you will need to send an email to the health insurance beforehand and specify whether you are receiving either a dental or a medical treatment. The health insurance will then send you a treatment certificate.

APPLICATION

After EHB received your nomination by your home university, we will send you an e-mail including the application form. Please fill out the form and send it to the Registry Office (Immatrikulationsamt). Afterwards you will receive your letter of admission. e-mail: immatrikulationsamt@eh-berlin.de

LEARNING AGREEMENT

Before arrival, a learning agreement must be signed. The EHB uses the Online Learning Agreement (OLA). Please send the draft of your learning agreement to: tanja.reith@eh-berlin.de
You can find the curriculum (Vorlesungsverzeichnis) on the EHB website at www.eh-berlin.de/en/study-programs if you click on your respective study programme.

ENROLLMENT

In order to matriculate as a student at EHB, you first have to pay the semester fee as indicated in the letter of admission. The Registration Office does not accept cash, therefore you must pay the semester fee by transfer before coming to Berlin.

MICROSOFT TEAMS AND E-LEARNING

The EHB uses Microsoft Teams and Microsoft Outlook for online communication and digital learning. Once you have paid your semester fee and are matriculated, you will receive a letter with your account information for Microsoft Teams and Outlook. You can use Microsoft Teams and Microsoft Outlook through your web browser or download the corresponding apps onto your device. Your student e-mail address is linked to Microsoft Outlook. In Microsoft Teams each of your courses will have their own "team", which you will be added to by the professor who teaches the course. Make sure to check all teams regularly as a lot of important information will be posted there. Some courses at the EHB are done partially on campus and partially online ("E-Learning"). For this reason you should check the current curriculum (Vorlesungsverzeichnis) to see when a course meets on campus and when it has an "E-Learning" appointment.

STUDENTS' ACCOMMODATION

If you have chosen to live in a student dormitory and have sent the application to EHB, you need to register at the "Wohnheimportal" at https://www.stw.berlin/wohnen.html.

The "InfoCenter Wohnen" of the Studierendenwerk also offers consultations for students looking for a room or flat.

You will be contacted by the studierendenWERK who administers all public halls of residence in Berlin. You should sign your accommodation contract as soon as possible and pay your first rent as well as the deposit to the student dormitory administration before arrival.

After arrival you will need the key to your room, which is handed out to you by the caretaker of the hall of residence. The student dormitory for EHB students is usually the one on Halbauer Weg 19-21, 12249 Berlin, although sometimes rooms are also allocated at other facilities around town. Please make sure that you call on the caretaker for the key during his or her office hours! To use the WiFi at the dorm you will need a router. Routers and blankets, pillows, bed sheets etc. are not provided by the dormitories! If you prefer to rent a furnished room in a private shared flat, we recommend you the website www.wg-gesucht.de.

INTERNSHIE

If you would like to do an internship semester in Berlin at/via the EHB you will need to be nominated by your university. In addition, you must have German language proficiency of at least B2 or higher.

Social work: You will need to find an internship at an organization or company in Berlin. Once you have a confirmed internship spot, you will need to contact the Praxisamt and they will make sure you are in one of the Praxisbegleitenden Seminaren (practice accompanying seminar) and that your internship will be accredited through the EHB. The Praxisamt will also be happy to assist you in finding an internship in Berlin.

Bachelor of Nursing/Midwifery: An internship can be arranged with the support of the EHB at an institution outside of EHB. Please note that the EHB is dependent on the availability of internships of its cooperation partners.

Due to the many formalities and bureaucratic efforts, we recommend to you to arrive at least one week before the beginning of the semester.

ENROLLMENT PT. 2

After arriving, you have to fill out the matriculation form (Immatrikulationsantrag). To request the form, please contact the Registration Office (Immatrikulationsamt). Once matriculated, you will get a student e-mail account and a student ID card which also serves as semester ticket.

REGISTRATION IN BERLIN

You will need to get registered as a resident of Berlin. This can be done in every "Bürgeramt" (= citizens registration office) of the city. You will need to bring your housing contract and a "Wohnungsgeberbestätigung", a document from your landlord which states that you have moved in into the flat stated in your housing contract. For every visit you need to have an appointment which you can book online: https://service.berlin.de/terminvereinbarung/ You can check the opening hours of your nearest "Bürgeramt" at: https://service.berlin.de/standorte/buergeraemter/

The nearest Bürgeramt to the EHB is at Kirchstraße 1/3.

HEALTH INSURANCE ■

To study in Germany, you must have a health insurance. If you have an insurance certificate or a European insurance card from your home country you need to get it acknowledged by a German statutory health insurance company. If you have a private health insurance, you will need to get an exemption from a statutory health insurance company. Please note that there might be difficulties if you plan to stay in Germany for a long time and want to change from a private to a statutory health insurance in the future. If your health insurance is not already covered or you are not insured at all, you will need to get a German student health insurance. Statutory health insurance companies you could contact are for example AOK, Barmer GEK or TK. The health insurance company will send the electronic insurance certificate to the university, after you submitted your documents.

BANK ACCOUNT

All students living in a student dormitory or wanting to work need to open a German bank account. You can do that at any bank you wish. Most of them offer bank accounts for free to students i.e., Deutsche Bank, Postbank and Sparkasse. A normal debit account is called a "Girokonto".

PAYMENT OF BROADCASTING FEES

A monthly fee of 18.36 euros is charged for every apartment in Germany, regardless of how many people live in that apartment or how many devices they use. This regulation also applies to rooms of any kind in a student dormitory. If you move into a room for subletting, the amount is probably already paid by your shared apartment or landlord. During your Stay

SEMESTER TICKET AND PUBLIC TRANSPORT

The semester ticket is included in your CampusCard (student ID). The semester ticket is valid from October 1st to March 31st during the winter term, and from April 1st to September 30th during the summer term. This ticket entitles you to unlimited travel within tarif zones A, B and C in Berlin by U-Bahn (subway), S-Bahn (local train), bus, tram and regional trains. The semester ticket is issued to you personally and is not transferable. It entitles children under six to travel with you. You may also travel with a bicycle, luggage or a dog.

The public transport associations of Berlin are called BVG and S-Bahn. For further questions ask at one of their shops at the main S-Bahn or U-Bahn stations in town. On their website https://www.bvg.de/en you will find all timetables and connections.

JOBS AND LABOUR PERMIT

Employment for non-Germans is strictly regulated. International students are allowed to work only 120 days (or 240 half days) per year without a work permit and there is little chance of acquiring permission to work beyond that. Exceptions exist for students from member states of the European Union and from Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway and Switzerland.

INTERNET

If you do not have an internet access at your place of living you can use the computer room at the EHB in Room B 102. It is open from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. if there are no lectures held inside.

MOBILE PHONE AND TELEPHONE

If you want to use a mobile phone you should bring along your own, since it is quite expensive to purchase one in Germany. A normal SIM-card without a contract costs about 5 € and is called "Prepaid-Card". You can choose between several companies e.g., E-Plus, O2 and Vodafone. If you want to compare the different offers you should go to the S-Bahn station "Alexanderplatz". On the ground floor you will find nearly all shops of German mobile providers.

If you want to call abroad you can find cheaper call-by-call providers at the internet site: http://www.billiger-telefonieren.de/. Just dial the prefix before the number you wish to reach. These numbers are not valid for calls by mobile phones! The dialling code for Germany is 0049, the code for Berlin is 030.

TRAVELLING **I**

If you want to travel in Germany or home there are several possibilities:

Before Departure

DEREGISTRATION AT EHB FOR ERASMUS STUDENTS

Please, deregister" from EHB upon your departure by writing or calling the Immatrikuationsamt at EHB. Let them know that you are an ERASMUS Student and will leave the country and the university. Immatrikulationsamt: Building A, rooms 111 and 112. Monday to Friday 9 am - 11 am

DEREGISTRATION IN BERLIN

When you return to your home country at the end of your stay you must "deregister". This involves another visit to the "Bürgeramt" where they register your departure. You will need to have an appointment which you can be booked online: https://service.berlin.de/terminvereinbarung/

CANCELLATION OF BROADCASTING FEES

When you return to your home country at the end of your stay, you must also "deregister" the payment of broadcasting fees. You can do this online at https://www.rundfunkbeitrag.de/buergerinnen_und_buerger/formulare/abmelden/index_ger.html. To do this, you will need evidence such as the deregistration certificate in Berlin, your Confirmation of Stay or similar.

TERMINATION OF RENTAL AGREEMENT

You will also need to terminate your rental agreement (if it hasn't been limited in time anyway). If you have rented a room

or apartment privately, you will need to arrange this with your landlord or landlady. Usually they require a 3-month notice before you move out.

If you were staying in a student dormitory, you will need to arrange a termination of your contract with the caretaker of your building. In most cases, this should be done 3 months before moving out and you should move out preferably at the end of the month.

BANK ACCOUNT

If you are not planning to return to Germany in the foreseeable future, it's advised that you close your German bank account before you depart in order to avoid monthly account fees. Your bank should be able to provide concise information on how to do this.

TELEPHONE ____

If you are not planning to return to Germany in the foreseeable future, it's advised that you cancel your mobile phone contract if you have one to avoid unnecessary costs.

CONFIRMATION OF STAY FOR ERASMUS STUDENTS

You will need to pick up you Confirmation of Stay from the International Office. This document confirms your participation in the Erasmus program at the EHB. You can only receive the Confirmation of Stay one day before departure or on the day of departure, not before or after. Please email Tanja Reith at tanja.reith@eh-berlin.de to arrange a time to pick it up.



Checklist

Before Arrival

- Fill out and send application form
- Draft a Learning Agreement on paper (from Summer semester 2023 on: fill out the Online Learning Agreement at <u>www.learning-agreement.eu/</u>) and get it signed by your home university and EHB
- Pay Semester fee
- Send Application for student dormitory to incoming@eh-berlin.de and register at the "Wohnheimportal" (if choosing to reside in a student dormitory)
- Register for a language class in case you want/need one

Upon Arrival

- Matriculation at EHB: hand in your matriculation form
- Check time for pick up your keys at the caretaker if you have been assigned a room in a student dormitory
- Register at the Citizens Registration Office (Bürgeramt)
- Apply for German health insurance or get private insurance or insurance from home country recognized
- Register your apartment online to pay the broadcasting fees
- If necessary: open German bank account
- If necessary: get the changes in your Learning Agreement by your home university and EHB

Departure I

- Deregister at EHB
- Deregister at Citizens Registration Office (Bürgeramt)
- Cancel the payment of broadcasting fees
- Terminate rental agreement if necessary (please check the agreed period of notice)
- Close bank account (if not returning to Germany soon) and terminate any other contracts you might have
- Pick up Confirmation of Stay
